Senior Services of Alexandria (SSA) fosters independence and self-sufficiency, enabling seniors within the City of Alexandria to age with dignity.

Dear Friends of Senior Services of Alexandria,

It has truly been a memorable year at Senior Services of Alexandria.

What makes it memorable for me is how COVID-19 continued to dominate our lives and affect the needs of seniors in Alexandria. With current practices of service delivery challenged, SSA quickly came up with solutions. Paid staff took over some Meals on Wheels delivery routes, and Groceries to Go was restructured to give volunteers more flexibility in scheduling their shopping to accommodate grocery store shortages. Friendly Visitors found new ways of staying in touch with isolated seniors when in-person visits were prohibited. Senior Law Day became a 3-day virtual event. Our Senior Ambassadors didn't miss a beat, continuing their outreach and communication to the community. SSA's two major fundraisers. Oktoberfest and Gala, were held on Zoom. And perhaps the most memorable accomplishment of all was the ability of SSA to get clients vaccinated. With many of our senior clients still living without access to the Internet or e-mail, it was a herculean effort, but one that was completed with outstanding success.

If I had one word to describe the past 12 months, it would be gratitude. Gratitude for an SSA Board that pivoted so quickly to change how we met as a Board and how we solved problems. Gratitude for an SSA team that was flexible as each day brought a new challenge. Gratitude to the sponsors and donors who never forgot SSA during this year of extreme need. And gratitude for the clients we serve, who accepted the uncertainty and changes with grace and were our inspiration to keep going.

With the world starting to reopen, we can almost forget the challenges of the past 12 months. But our success story of not just surviving but thriving during this difficult year will always be remembered.

130,000 meals served, 3,300 grocery shopping trips and deliveries to 115Groceries-to-Go clients, 55 Friendly Visitors, 90 Senior Ambassadors, over 600 SSA clients vaccinated. Yes, the past 12 months have made for a memorable year...one that I will remember proudly for all that Senior Services of Alexandria was able to accomplish.

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# SSA'S CONNECTIONS TO THE COMMUNITY

Since its inception in 1968, SSA has served as a vital connection for older adults in the Alexandria community. As the senior population continues to grow, SSA's programs and services will grow as well to help fill the gap when they need us. Current SSA services and programs are featured below.

# SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAMS Meals on Wheels

This life-sustaining program allows seniors who are unable to leave their homes, or who have difficulty preparing a meal, to have two healthy meals a day delivered to their homes. Meals are delivered 365 days a year, including holidays, by over 500 volunteers. Senior Services, in partnership with the City of Alexandria, is currently serving 100 clients throughout the city.

The Meals on Wheels team stepped up to the challenge of providing Meals on Wheels plus a new Frozen Meals program when the pandemic hit Alexandria. Strict health protocols went into place, including asking some of SSA's older volunteers to take a break and creating a small corps of younger volunteers, including SSA and City staff. SSA hasn't missed a single day of delivering since the outbreak and is currently delivering 2,000 meals a week.

Over the course of a few months in early 2021, we were able to coordinate vaccine appointments and taxi rides to and from each appointment for the majority of our clients.

# Groceries to Go

The Groceries to Go shopping and delivery program celebrated its sixth anniversary last year. What started in the Fall of 2014 with 12 clients and 10 volunteers has now grown to over 100 older adults with 80 volunteers shopping for and delivering groceries to their designated seniors every other week. At its peak during the pandemic, more than 90 volunteers shopped for and delivered groceries to 125 seniors. The program has continued during the COVID-19 pandemic and is proving to be an

invaluable service to older adults. There are no delivery or other fees, making this program a more appealing option than other store delivery services for all seniors, but especially for those who pay for their groceries using SNAP Benefits. Each volunteer is paired up with a senior. If the senior doesn't have e-mail, the volunteer calls the senior every two weeks to get their shopping list over the phone.

Groceries to Go program director Sandy Freedman called 125 seniors in the grocery program to make sure they had vaccination appointments, scheduled taxi rides to and from those appointments, and scheduled in-home vaccinations for a few seniors who are unable to leave their homes. For those seniors who do not have access to the Internet, Sandy signed them up while on the phone with each of those seniors.



Through the Caring Connection program, SSA partners with healthcare entities to provide daily check-ins for seniors recently discharged from a medical facility. Staff conduct in-home visits and change-of-condition monitoring while also providing meals. The goal of Caring Connection is to provide nutrition and monitoring to vulnerable seniors while sharing critical information with healthcare professionals to reduce the likelihood of readmissions. Seniors are able to maintain their independence while receiving check-ins, healthy meals, and guidance in the comfort of their own homes. SSA now partners with Woodbine Rehabilitation & Healthcare Center and Goodwin House at Home and has continued providing these services throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

### COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

# AniMeals

AniMeals provides food for pets of seniors residing in the City of Alexandria. In partnership with the Animal Welfare League of Alexandria, SSA is currently delivering pet food and supplies for dogs, cats, and birds in 30 households throughout the City. Thanks to our volunteers, who continued deliveries throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

# Friendly Visitor

Carefully screened and trained volunteers are matched with socially isolated seniors, whom they visit in their homes or resident communities for at least an hour every week. Both volunteers and seniors are interviewed regarding their personal history and interests to facilitate a compatible match.

SSA has partnered with not only local assisted living facilities, but also with individual seniors, to match isolated seniors with volunteers to visit virtually by phone or written notes due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions. There are currently 20 new virtual matches with residents from Woodbine Homecare & Rehabilitation, Goodwin House Alexandria, the Hermitage, and Sunrise Senior Living of Alexandria.

# Department of Transportation (DOT) Paratransit Call Center

Since 1984, SSA has managed the (DOT) Paratransit Program Call Center for the City of Alexandria. SSA schedules reduced-rate rides for over 1,200 City of Alexandria residents with physical or mental disabilities.

SSA has continued to handle reservations during the pandemic to allow clients to keep medical appointments and get essential items such as groceries. It has been a lifesaver for people who rely on this service.

# Senior Ambassador Program

SSA's Senior Ambassador program has been amazingly successful. The original plan called for 50 ambassadors by 2021, and SSA has already recruited and trained 100 volunteers on the broad array of services and programs available to older residents.

After completion of training, the ambassadors are prepared to share what they have learned with their community, which may be a faith-based group, condo, neighborhood, city agency, or corporation.

During the pandemic, Senior Ambassadors played an important role in getting information out on a variety of topics, especially about the COVIDvaccination process, as well as other programs to keep older adults engaged while staying safe at home. The group continues to meet on a weekly Zoom with a guest speaker talking about a variety of programs and services for older adults.


# EDUCATION AND OUTREACH Speaker Series

SSA's in-person Senior Speaker Series went on hiatus during the past year because of the pandemic, but SSA led virtual programming, including a Scam Prevention workshop, local historic tours, and a container gardening webinar.


In addition, SSA added a weekly e-mail called "SSA Connection" which provides links to uplifting short videos including Ted Talks, cooking demos, fitness programs, and links to local virtual events.

SSA collaborated with the Alexandria Bar Association to present its second virtual Senior Law Day. The 2021 workshop focused on "Lessons Learned from the COVID-19 Pandemic".

The three-day session, once a week for three weeks, featured speakers from Goodwin House, Inova Alexandria Hospital, local geriatric care specialists, and estate planning attorneys. Over 100 registered for the event.






