- Overarching goal: Enable older adults to remain in the community as long as possible
 - Delay or avoid need for care facility
 - Delay or avoid leaving Alexandria
- Facets of program
 - Financial assistance
 - Environment
 - Supportive services

Adult Day Services Center



- 5-day per week program, 7:30 a.m. 5:30 p.m. for City residents age 55 and over
- Therapeutic recreation
- Nursing service, including medication monitoring and administration
- Nutritious noon-time meal and snacks
- Transportation using the DOT program
- Supportive services for caregivers

Adult Protective Services



- Investigates suspected abuse, neglect or financial exploitation
 - Adults age 60 and over
 - Adults with disabilities, age 18 and over
- Public encouraged to report suspicion
 - Identity of reporters remains confidential
 - People can reject offer of help from APS

Adult Supportive Services



- Care coordination for older adults and adults with disabilities
 - Require on-going services
 - Meet income guidelines at or below 50% of the Virginia median income
- Homemaker personal care services
- Chronic disease nurse
- Personal Emergency Response System
- Options Counseling

Older Adult Mental Health



- Assessments
- Emergency intervention
- Counseling and therapy
- Make home visits with Adult Protective Services, as needed

Meals on Wheels

Delivered 7 days a week to homebound seniors 60 and older

City Subsidized Private Pay



Groceries to Go

Volunteers grocery shop and deliver to older adults who find grocery shopping difficult.



Companionship

Friendly Visitor Program

Volunteers matched with socially isolated older adults for weekly visits.

Grandpad Program – allowing isolated seniors to stay connected.



Transportation

DOT Paratransit

Provides transportation for persons who find it difficult to use public transportation. SSA manages the reservations for client.



Animeals on Wheels

Delivery of pet food to pets of low-income older adults.

Partnership with Animal Welfare League of Alexandria delivering pet food once a month.



Local non-profit serving Alexandria City and Washington, DC low-income older adults with free home repairs who meet income requirements.
