Highlights:

- Created the Legacy Giving Program. Along with all the programs that SSA produces, I am very proud that we were able to launch SSA's Legacy Giving Program. In November we held our first informational luncheon about the program, which provides ways Senior Services of Alexandria can be represented in your will, trusts, and estate plans. We hope you will all consider adding legacy giving to SSA in your estate plan. Gratitude to the Board of Directors and staff who lead the efforts of this important initiative.
- Established the Kerry Donley Meals on Wheels Gift Fund. SSA's Board of Directors approved a resolution in memory of our former Board Chair and community leader Kerry Donley. - Led by Award- Winning Executive Director Mary Lee Anderson. In May, Mary Lee was recognized during the 2023 Excellence in Aging Awards. She received the Annie B. Rose Lifetime Achievement Award for outstanding service to our senior adult community from the Alexandria Commission on Aging. Gratitude to Mary Lee for keeping me looking good.

SSA'S CONNECTIONS TO THE COMMUNITY

Since its inception in 1968, SSA has served as a vital connection for older adults in the Alexandria community. As the senior population continues to grow, SSA's programs and services will grow as well to help fill the gap when they need us. Current SSA services and programs are featured below.

SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAMS

Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels continues to deliver MORE than a meal with help from our amazing volunteers. This year we were able to bring back a lot of groups who were not able to help during COVID and add many new ones! It is great to see new faces involved in this program, and we are proud to have so many individuals and groups that prioritize the needs of seniors!

We currently deliver to 120 individuals during any given week, and we have prioritized expanding access to our sponsored service through the Kerry Donley Memorial Fund. There are many seniors in Alexandria who could use support where they live, but do not qualify for City funded service. We can deliver Meals on Wheels to these clients three days a week and help relieve the financial and physical burden of grocery shopping and preparing meals. Seniors on limited fixed income have faced some large challenges, and with growing costs across the board, this program can be a real lifeline.

Given the expansion of this program, and the impact it has, we are proud to announce that we will be upgrading and updating our Meals on Wheels area at Jeffrey's Catering Company. We look forward to having a space that reflects the hard work of staff and the commitment from volunteers who deliver meals. We will share more as we work to improve the space, stay tuned!

Through the Caring Connection program, SSA partners with healthcare entities to provide daily check-ins for seniors recently discharged from a medical facility. Staff conduct in-home visits and change-of-condition monitoring while also providing meals. The goal of Caring Connection is to provide nutrition and monitoring to vulnerable seniors while sharing critical information with healthcare professionals to reduce the likelihood of readmissions. Seniors are able to maintain their independence while receiving check-ins, healthy meals, and guidance in the comfort of their own homes. SSA partners with Woodbine Rehabilitation & Healthcare Center, Alexandria Rehabilitation & Healthcare Center, and Goodwin House at Home.

Groceries to Go

Our grocery delivery service continues to serve over 100 isolated seniors with mobility issues at their homes with no added fees. We are grateful for the volunteers and the relationships they form with their seniors. We have heard some amazing stories and are happy to facilitate the very personal connections that form when shopping for someone else! We continue to look for new ways to get seniors involved and expand access to this program. While there are many apps and services these days that deliver groceries and food, none offer the connection and resourcefulness of our volunteers. From how ripe a client wants their bananas to finding items on sale, our volunteers truly care about making every grocery run as good as it can be! Thanks again to the volunteers who shop and deliver these orders to the seniors who need it.

SNAP benefits decreased this March for many in our community. To address this concern among SNAP recipients in the grocery program, SSA formed a new partnership with ALIVE! We now deliver free groceries, typically around 35 lbs of food, to these seniors at the beginning of each month. Clients have expressed their gratitude and were impressed with the quality of the donated food we have delivered to them. We deliver the necessary grocery staples along with fresh produce and frozen meats. This delivery allows the seniors to spend their remaining SNAP benefits on anything else they need. We hope to grow this program with the support of more volunteers in the future. There are certainly more folks out there who could use the support, and we are more than happy to help.

COMPANION PROGRAMS

AniMeals

AniMeals on Wheels continues to provide food for pets of older adults residing in the City of Alexandria. SSA is currently delivering pet food and supplies for dogs, cats, birds, and rabbits in 30 households throughout the City. As a grantee of Meals on Wheels Loves Pets, AniMeals on Wheels was highlighted in PetSmart's new media video. With cameras in tow, PetSmart created a video of our volunteer loading pet food from our partner, Animal Welfare League of Alexandria, delivering the pet food, and an interview with the AniMeals client.

Friendly Visitor

SSA started the Friendly Visitor program to help combat isolation and loneliness among elderly persons by providing social interaction through weekly visits. As an alternative to face-to-face visits, older adults and volunteers are given the option to socialize virtually. Our Friendly Visitor volunteers range from the age of 22 to 93 years old, and some volunteers are matched with more than one older adult.

The GrandpadTablet Program


The GrandPad Tablet Program provides older adults with an easy-to-use tablet device that addresses the negative impact of social isolation. Thanks to a new contract with the Division of Aging and Adult Services, SSA manages 42 tablets connecting clients with loved ones, music, games and information.

Department of Transportation (DOT) Paratransit Call Center

Since 1984, SSA has managed the (DOT) Paratransit Program Call Center for the City of Alexandria. SSA schedules reduced-rate rides for over 1,500 City of Alexandria residents with physical or mental disabilities.

This year, SSA hired a Spanish speaking reservationist to better serve that population. Also, DOT extended their reach to Washington, DC and as of 2021, all rides within the City of Alexandria are free.

SSA worked with the City's Department of Transportation to implement a new system which allows clients to make their own reservations via the Alexandria DOT mobile app. The transportation director now handles new client applications, customer support, as well as continuing to schedule rides for the many clients who require personal support.

Silver Service Card

The Silver Service Card encourages Alexandria's older residents to patronize local businesses and restaurants through a targeted discount program. There are 43 businesses throughout the City participating in the Silver Service Card program.



EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

Senior Ambassador Program

SSA's Senior Ambassador program has been amazingly successful. SSA has recruited and trained over 130 volunteers on the broad array of services and programs available to older residents.

Senior Ambassadors play an important role in getting information out on a variety of topics important to older adults including new programs and services available as well as fun activities and events that the City has to offer. Weekly Zoom meetings connect our members with guest speakers on relevant topics.

Spanish-Speaking Outreach

SSA's goal is to reach older adults in Alexandria from every neighborhood, including those whose native language is not English. SSA has connected with local non-profits, such as Casa Chirilagua and ALIVE!, to identify older adults in need and build trust in the community. The Senior Ambassador program in Spanish- Embajadores de la Tercera Edad- is going strong with 9 Ambassadors who receive weekly updates to share with their communities. In addition, SSA sends a monthly newsletter in Spanish to over 30 people!

SSA now has two Spanish speaking staff members who work together to support this effort by translating materials, participating in weekly outreach, assisting Spanish speaking clients, and organizing events such as a monthly Bingo.

In 2022, The Division of Aging and Adult Services awarded SSA a 3-year contract in support of our outreach program.

EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

"Senior Living in Alexandria"

SSA's Speaker Series "Senior Living in Alexandria" connects residents with local experts sharing the most current information. Topics included Senior Technology and Scam Prevention; Caregiving; Genealogy; Floral Arranging and the Senior Health & Fitness Fair.

Plans are underway for a robust schedule of monthly events for the 2023-2024 calendar which will begin with the Senior Academy in September.


This year's Senior Law Day brought over 150 people together at First Baptist Church for a program on "Expect the Unexpected – When Life Throws you a Curveball." It is the 12th year SSA and the Alexandria Bar Association have offered this program for residents.

We had a great group of local experts talking about the importance of being prepared with the proper legal documents, housing options as we age, later in life marriages; and planning for adult disabled children and those living at home.

SSA's weekly e-mail "SSA Connection" is very popular and shares uplifting short videos including Ted Talks, cooking demos, fitness programs, and links to local events.

In a new initiative to connect with our wider community, SSA has teamed up with several assisted living and retirement communities to bring programming to their residents. So far, we have organized events on Genealogy, Brain Health, Poetry and Flower Arranging.

Senior Information Corners

Volunteers stock senior information corners with current literature for seniors at 26 locations, including City libraries, major recreation centers, and senior communities. Materials in both English and Spanish are available with relevant information for the older adult community. With generous funding from the Rotary Club of Alexandria in 2022, SSA purchased information stands and has set up 4 new information corners and more will be coming soon!




